

It detailed that the AGM is scheduled for the 15th of February 2025, set against the picturesque backdrop of the Lapa at Rietvlei Nature Reserve. This setting promises a conducive environment for conducting our annual review and strategizing for the future.

We would like to extend our gratitude to members who responded to our call to participate in deciding whether to change the venue for the AGM to B'sorah, a beautiful farm just a stone's throw away from Hartbeespoort Dam. The feedback revealed strong support for both changing the venue and continuing well-established our tradition of hosting the AGM at the picturesque Rietvlei Nature Reserve.

After

careful

consideration of the responses received, the Committee Executive noted that a significant draw for B'sorah was the opportunity for members to camp at the venue after the AGM activities concluded. However, there was insufficient time to fully evaluate member interest in participating in such an overnight stay.

Consequently, it was decided that for 2025, the Club should maintain its long-standing tradition of hosting the AGM at Rietvlei. Throughout the year, we will dedicate more time to determining if adding a camping option after the AGM garners enough interest to justify a change in venue in the future.

In addition to our 65th Annual General Meeting, the Land Rover Owners Club of Southern Africa is also thrilled to be hosting our Blue Sapphire Celebration in September of this year, commemorating our 65th anniversary in grand style. This milestone event promises to be a memorable celebration of our club's rich history and enduring community spirit.

We are pleased to report that the sub-committee, established to coordinate the various activities and requirements for the celebration, is well underway with their planning. Their dedication ensures that all aspects of the event are meticulously organized to provide an unforgettable experience for all attendees.

As the date approaches, we look forward to regularly updating our members with the progress of the sub-committee. We are excited to share these developments as we edge ever closer to September and what promises to be a truly remarkable celebration.

In addition to events that celebrate our proud journey as a Club, the 2025 events calendar was established using a data-driven approach, meticulously crafted from detailed analysis of actual participation member statistics from our 2024 events. This marks a strategic shift from the previous year, which relied heavily on feedback from our 2023 Membership Survey. By using actual participation data, we ensure that our calendar aligns more closely with the true preferences and activities of our community.

One of the standout successes in the Gauteng region during 2024 was the 'Landys and Lattes' event, which has shown consistent growth in participation since its inception at the start of 2023. After careful consideration of last year's trends, we have decided to increase the number of 'Landys and Lattes' events for 2025, scaling back on the 'Trail Blaze' events, which received comparatively less support last year.

The Club has scheduled a cross-border event to the picturesque northern reaches of Botswana, which has proven to be incredibly popular with our members and remains fully subscribed. This event underscores the enduring appeal of exploring new territories and the consistent enthusiasm of our

community for unique and adventurous experiences.

Our Club's unwavering commitment to preservation of wilderness areas in South Africa continues to guide our planning. This year, we have scheduled the Tembe Work Week and the Tembe Fundraiser for April, followed by support for the Endangered Wildlife running Trust's trail initiative in July. These events not only align with our dedication to conservation but offer members engaging contribute ways to to these vital efforts.

Other signature events such as the LROC Braai & Boot event, the everpopular Loskop Weekend Away, and the Willems Rus Weekend Away remain fixtures on our calendar. Additionally, the Executive Committee is planning enrich our yearly schedule by incorporating other specialty events, including training sessions and mountain drives. These activities will be strategically interspersed throughout the year, offering diverse and engaging experiences for all our members.

A noticeable change this year concerns the annual LROC Christmas Function, which has seen lackluster support in recent years. As the average age of our membership increases and the number of children in the Club decreases, this demographic shift has significantly impacted our Christmas Function, which was primarily structured to entertain our youngest family members.

In response to these changes, 2025 will see the traditional two-day Christmas function evolve into a Christmas Breakfast. This new format aims to leverage the tremendous support received over the past two years for the final 'Landys and Lattes' event, hosted at Rietvlei's coffee

These must be submitted to the Club Secretary either by delivery or email no later than seven days prior to the AGM. This structured approach guarantees that nominations are properly processed and recognized, facilitating organized and efficient election proceedings.

Constitution The also provides that members of the Executive Committee automatically retire after a two-year term but may reelection. This stipulation allows for both continuity and the infusion of fresh ideas into the leadership. Moreover, any member of the Executive Committee can resign at any time by providing notice, written

ensuring flexibility and responsiveness to personal or professional demands.

Marketing Officer, as provided for in Clause 9.2.5: Rori Meanwell currently serves as the Marketing Officer, elected to the role in 2024. Rori shall be serving her second year in office in 2025.

Let's talk ORRA



Effective communication is a vital part of any offroad adventure, and for the Land Rover Owners Southern Club of Africa (LROC), the **Radio** Off-Road Association (ORRA) ensures that members can stay connected reliably and legally. Since its establishment in 1977 by the Land **Rover Owners Club of** Southern Africa, the 4x4 ATV Club (then the Jeep Club of Southern Africa), and the Four Wheel Drive Club of Southern Africa, ORRA has been at the forefront of facilitating two-way radio communication for off-road enthusiasts across the country.

ORRA has grown alongside advancements in technology, beginning with 27MHzCB radios in its early years, before transitioning 29MHz frequencies in 1979, and introducing frequencies VHF collaboration 2006 in with the Independent **Communications Authority** of South Africa (ICASA). This progression reflects ORRA's commitment to providing reliable and modern communication solutions to meet the needs of the off-road community.

A cornerstone of ORRA's

role is recognizing legitimate off-road clubs andgrantingtheirmembers access to radio licenses. This structured approach fosters responsible use of radio communication while ensuring compliance with South Africa's Telecommunications Act. specific Bymanaging frequencies for offroad activities, ORRA promotes safe, effective communication that enhances the overall offroad experience.

ORRA also facilitates crossborder communication for adventurers exploring Botswana and Namibia. Through carefully negotiated agreements, LROC members and other enthusiasts can legally use their VHF radios in these countries, provided they obtain the required documentation in advance. This initiative is invaluable for off-roaders who want to remain connected during their journeys beyond South Africa's borders.

For LROC members who wish to join ORRA's network, the process is straightforward. By submitting an application form along with proof of club membership and the required fees, members can secure a user authorization card, granting them access to ORRA's designated radio frequencies. This

ensures compliance with national regulations while unlocking a critical tool for safety and coordination during off-road adventures.

The importance of using licensed radio equipment cannot be overstated. Operating unlicensed transmitters is not only illegal but can disrupt vital communication networks. ORRA's licensing framework ensures that offroad enthusiasts can enjoy worry-free communication while respecting broader communication systems.

Whether navigating tough trails, coordinating convoy movements, or sharing stories over the airwaves, reliable communication is essential for any off-road adventure. ORRA's work makes it easier than ever for LROC members to focus on what matters most exploring the beauty of Southern Africa. Although our Club has been in existence for over 63 years and has matured as an organization, and we recognize that we are never too old to make new friends and embrace new experiences.


We are excited to have you as part of our community, and we look forward to creating new memories and sharing many adventures together.


